Water use: unsustainable amounts of water are needed for fracking operations.

Fracking wastewater: Hazardous chemicals are used that destroy water and there is no proven safe method of disposal.

Climate impacts: CO<sub>2</sub> and methane are very damaging to the environment. Air emissions and seismicity are all real concerns. Fracking for shale oil presents unique risks including increased volatility during transport.

Socio-economic impacts: low-income communities are often targeted. The promise of jobs rarely transpires.
